1. The book of James is all about faith that works and the only faith that

really works is ______ faith in Jesus Christ!

1. AS DOERS, WE MUST STOP

James 2:1 (CSB)

¹ My brothers and sisters, **DO NOT** show favoritism as you hold on to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ.

1) Forgotten attribute of God - _____

Deuteronomy 10:17 (CSB)

¹⁷ For the LORD your God is the God of gods and Lord of lords, the great, mighty, and awe-inspiring God, showing no partiality and taking no bribe.

Romans 2:11 (CSB)

James 2:2–4 (CSB)

² For if someone comes into your meeting wearing a gold ring and dressed in fine clothes, and a poor person dressed in filthy clothes also comes in, ³ if you look with favor on the one wearing the fine clothes and say, "Sit here in a good place," and yet you say to the poor person, "Stand over there," or "Sit here on the floor by my footstool," ⁴ haven't you made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts?

3. REASON FAVORITISM IS WRONG #1 -

James 2:5–7 (CSB)

⁵ Listen, my dear brothers and sisters: Didn't God choose the poor in this world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? ⁶ Yet you have dishonored the poor. Don't the rich oppress you and drag you into court? 7 Don't they blaspheme the good name that was invoked over you?

4. REASON FAVORITISM IS WRONG #2 - _____

James 2:8–11 (CSB)

⁸ Indeed, if you fulfill the royal law prescribed in the Scripture, **Love your** neighbor as yourself, you are doing well.⁹ If, however, you show favoritism, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. ¹⁰ For whoever keeps the entire law, and yet stumbles at one point, is guilty of breaking it all.¹¹ For he who said, **Do not commit adultery**, also said, **Do not** murder. So if you do not commit adultery, but you murder, you are a lawbreaker.

_____ it! (Romans 13:8-10, Galatians 5:14)

Matthew 22:37–40 (CSB)

³⁷ He said to him, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. ³⁸ This is the greatest and most important command. ³⁹ The second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself. ⁴⁰ All the Law and the Prophets depend on these two commands."

James 2:12–13 (CSB)

¹² Speak and act as those who are to be judged by the law of freedom. ¹³ For judgment is without mercy to the one who has not shown mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

Practical Steps:

- 1) Pray that God will give you a love for others like His love.
- 2) Avoid cliques, speak to someone new between services.
- 3) Invite someone new to your small group or bible study.
- 4) Treat everyone with the same respect and honor you desire.
- 5) Don't show favoritism at church, work, or at home.
- 6) Do a personal study on God's impartiality.
- 7) Teach your children about what God says concerning favoritism.
- 8) Make the book of James a regular part of your Bible reading.
